1993 Alumnus Dr. Daniel Leiding Inducted into 2006 Hall of Fame



1993 MLHS Alumnus, Dr. Dan Leiding was inducted into the Martin Luther High School Athletic Hall of Fame at the Spring Recognition Ceremony. Leiding graduated from MLHS in 1993 as an honor student and Valedictorian of his class.

An exceptional athlete, he played football his freshman and sophomore years until he suffered a head injury at the beginning of his junior season. He was named to the All-Area football team as a sophomore.

Leiding played baseball all four years. He was named All Conference each year and All-Area three of those years. As a senior he was Co-Captain of the All-Area team, had a .558 batting average, 12 stolen bases and 3.20 ERA.

As an MLHS Knight athlete, Leiding dominated the basketball court as freshman, sophomore and senior. He served as team manager as a junior when he was unable to play due to his head injury. He was named All Conference and All-Area as a sophomore and senior. As a senior, Leiding was third leading scorer in the Conference, averaging 23 points per game, 9.4 rebounds, 18 blocked shots, 60 assists and 46 steals. He was named to the All-Tournament team at the Jackson Holiday Tournament as a sophomore and senior, setting a tournament record as a senior, scoring 91 points

in three games. He scored a game high of 39 points that year. He was named KEYC Prep Athlete of the Week and Fairmont Exchange Club Youth of the Month.

Leiding attended Luther College in Decorah, IA as a Biology major and played basketball four years and baseball one year. He graduated from the University of Iowa

Medical School and is now an emergency room physician in St. Petersburg, Florida.

Dan’s parents, Merlin and Wanda Leiding accepted the award on Dan’s behalf. He extended his thanks to the MLHS Athletic Committee via e-mail:

“I would like to thank all involved for this honor. Martin Luther will always have a special place in my heart as a place to grow spiritually, academically, and athletically. It offered a solid starting point for my life’s journey, and athletics was an integral part. Certainly, my fondest memories are due in large part to the good people I played with and was coached by, and, equally as important, the faculty and volunteers who spent extra hours so that athletics could be offered.

I want to apologize for being unable to attend, but would extend my humble thanks from afar. The memories made and lessons learned have remained both fond and valuable assets. And I pray that MLHS will continue to offer its stu-

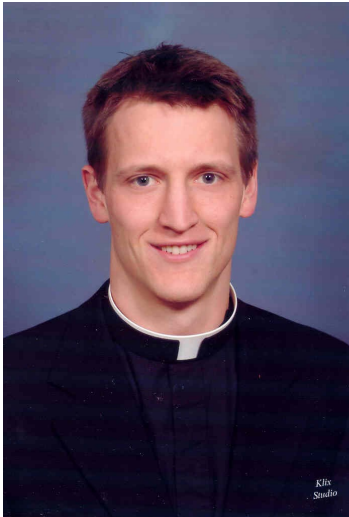

Principal Robert B. Patrick Awarded Study Grant



Principal and history teacher, Robert Patrick will be participating in an all-expense paid two week institute on "Churchill and America" being held at Ashland University in Ashland, Ohio. The aim of the institute is to provide high school teachers with a focus for approaching crucial political events of the twentieth century through the life, reflections and experiences of Winston Churchill. The institute will concen-

trate on Churchill's views of democratic politics in the United State and of the Anglo-American relationship in peace and in war.

The Ashbrook Center is offering thirteen summer institutes that will assist teachers in deepening and broadening both their understanding and appreciation of American history. The focus of the institutes will be the substantive study of American history. The discussions will revolve around original historical documents and their use in the classroom.

These intensive institutes encourage history teachers to deepen and broaden their understanding of American history. The intensive summer institutes hosted by the Ashbrook Center always focus on historical topics that social studies teachers need to understand to be well-prepared. Unlike most professional

development programs for teachers, which focus solely on teaching methods, these seminars emphasize substantive themes of American history. Their discussions revolve around primary source documents and their use in the classroom as a way to engage students and increase student achievement.

This Institute is a joint project of the National Endowment of the Humanities, The Churchill Centre in Washington, D.C. and the Ashbrook Center for Public Affairs at Ashland University. This is an ideal partnership for this institute. The world's pre-eminent scholars on Winston Churchill are associated with The Churchill Centre, and they will provide the academic program for the institute. The Ashbrook Center has years of extensive experience offering programs for secondary teachers, and the Center will coordinate and administer the institute.
