- Celebrate MLHS Sunday and hold a door offering the first Sunday in December.


- View and promote MLHS as an extension of the congregational ministry.



Eighty-five percent of the MLHS graduates go on to some form of higher education.

Some graduates have become pastors, teachers, or missionaries. Others take their faith with them and succeed in a variety of careers. There are MLHS Alumni that are film makers, photographers, social workers, veterinarians, theatre majors, medical professionals, farmers, swine herdsman, nurses, sales people, stay-at-home parents and computer specialists.

Each has God's Word and love embedded in their hearts for eternity—which cannot be taken away from them!

As 1996 alumni, Jonathan Mumme, said in his graduation address, "The bond between us has grown so strong. It's true that every night I thank God for my Christian classmates and for my school. These two forces have helped keep my eyes on the goal and for this

I love my friends, and I love my school.

"This is why Martin Luther High School and the surrounding Lutheran grade schools must continue on. We, the class of 1996, are proof of what is possible with a Christian education. We are proof that a young person's faith and Christian morals can remain intact during the high school years. It is true that I would not be the Jonathan Mumme that I am today without Martin Luther High School. For this I thank my schools, my teachers, the staff, the Board of Directors, the PTL and everyone else who works so hard for this institution."

After graduation Jonathan attended Concordia University, River Forest, then St. Louis Seminary. In 2001 he studied at a seminary in Cambridge, England. Then he vicared at St. Marian's Lutheran Church in Berlin, Germany. A 2006 Fullbright Scholarship winner, Rev. Mumme studied Martin Luther's ordination sermons in Tübingen, Germany for one year under one of the top Lutheran scholars in the world, Professor Dr. Oswald Bayer.

1996 Alumni Rev. Dr. Jonathan Mumme credited MLHS for preparing him for life. He has vicared and studied in Europe and learned German, Greek and Hebrew. His is continuing his studies in Tübingen, Germany.
